Facing the diagnosis of cancer can
be a frightening prospect. For those
with financial concerns, the burden is
magnified. The Caddo-Bossier Cancer
Foundation League is a nonprofit organi-
zation dedicated to making life easier for
patients undergoing cancer treatment at
the Willis-Knighton Cancer Center. The
League provides direct assistance such as
transportation, lodging and personal items
to support these patients. Best of all, 100%
of the funds raised are distributed locally.

The CBCFL’s referral process is initiated by the W-K Cancer Center patient’s physician of those who could benefit from our assistance. Formed in 2011, the League initially offered support of up to \$300 per patient per year. Larger grants are now available due to membership and fund raising growth.

Organized by cancer survivors and their families, the League is guided by leaders who understand the emotional and financial issues faced by those dealing with cancer treatment. Beyond the issue of “Will I survive?” are more mundane but very stressful issues: Who can take me to my treatment? Can I afford the medications? How can I come to Shreveport from out-of-town?



As patients struggle with finances, travel and lodging issues, they may not be able to receive care as recommended by their physicians.

While the League was established by cancer survivors and their families, membership is open to all who want to help others. An annual membership gift to the League supports the work of this volunteer organization in providing grants to patients. Because the League is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, all gifts, memberships and other fund raising efforts are tax deductible to the extent allowed by the Internal Revenue Service.

Distribution of grants to patients is provided following a careful review of applicants who are referred by their physicians. The League’s patient services staff work with social workers at the Willis-Knighton Cancer Center to assure that the individual needs of patients are met in the most efficient and supportive manner.

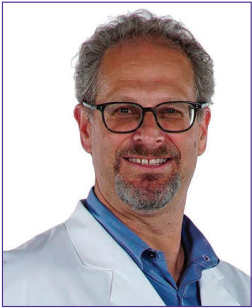
The League’s office is located at 3300 Albert L. Bicknell Drive and provides care to patients undergoing treatment there, but it is not an affiliate of Willis-Knighton. Thus, memberships and fund raisers are critical to its growth as it seeks to serve larger numbers of patients. As technology at the Willis-Knighton Cancer Center expands, more and more people from out-of-town will seek care at the facility, and assistance from our organization.
